


Since the last update that we shared on the VC Mitchell Park Project, we've continued the transition of moving from Hold Point 2 to Hold Point 3.

An official presentation to Council and to the Project Consultation Group (PCG) was made, covering the entire design and delving into the financials as well. There was a recent meeting with the PCG, Commissioner, the project Superintendent, and a representative from Perkins Builders. At this meeting, discussions surrounding the following took place:

Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) Compliance has been met to a higher standard, with a new architectural style corridor entryway providing a second ramp that provides even better access to Pavilion 2 (various perspective images provided below);

- Following several constructive and positive discussions with the Department of Local Government, Sporting and Cultural Industries (DLGSC) for additional funding (like many other similar projects across the state), the Shire is expecting a final result in the near future;
- Feedback from the PCG has been consistent and unified by the end of all meetings, with everyone in attendance focusing on building the best space for everyone in the community alongside our valued sports clubs (those who require more accessibility, options for families, business networking and function/meeting spaces, potential opportunities for community-led art installations, etc.), and;
- Discussion and check-ins are consistently taking place with the PCG members individually as well, with proposals in the pipeline for permanent, weather-proof storage and shelter options for the Hockey Club.
